Add to the list of things I don't do so well the act (or the art) of saying goodbye. It's not that I haven't had enough practice. But practice doesn't always make perfect, and practice doesn't always make difficult tasks easy. And it's not that I don't realize that endings must, of necessity, precede new beginnings. I do know that. It's just that grief is a painful reality that won't go away quickly because we wish that it would. Relationships are built slowly and carefully (and prayerfully) over time with many words and many more caring interactions. When the time comes for those relationships to change, folks don't just click their heels together, spin around three times, snap their fingers, and enter a new dimension of reality. Goodbyes are hard.

-Thank You for allowing me to share so many of the significant moments in your lives...times of great sorrow, times of great joy, and all of the ordinary times as well. You have extended to me the high and holy privilege of walking beside you. And for that, I'll be eternally grateful.

-Thank You for all of your kind and encouraging words since the announcement of my retirement was made. Faster than a speeding bullet, that's how quickly forty-six years of ordained ministry have passed for me. It is with mixed emotions that Mickey and I anticipate the page turning of the next chapter.

It is not yet a common happening in our system for an Associate Pastor to become the Senior Pastor. But in regard to NFUMC I think that it is an awesome thing! 



WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY - Summer Coffee and Chat



Draw the Circle Wide, a familiar anthem of unity for all people, all cultures and all generations came to mind on Wednesday as Charles, David, Andrew, and I attended the sweetest reception given at Wesley Woods in honor of three of us "graduating" and one beginning. As many of you know, Wesley Woods is rich in residents who "belong" to Newnan FUMC, some of the kindest, friendliest, full of life and always up for some words of wisdom, people I know. And not to mention the beauty and grace of those lovely women and loving men. The area where we met was so bright, beautifully appointed with round tables covered with sparkling white linens and comfortable chairs for all to rest so we could visit. As we were greeted and began visiting with the early arrivals, more people began to arrive. Soon the one table where we were was not large enough for all, but with ease, each person would simply push their chair back a bit to make room for the new arrivals. And soon, we had more than the 8 people the table was originally meant to have, but no bother, we simply drew the circle wider, and then a bit wider and soon there were two tables included in the circle and ultimately a second row around the circle. People who had been friends, chosen family, life long residents of Coweta County, people who had chosen to move to Coweta County, those who were still here even though the job that brought them here had long been gone into retirement, those who had lost their home in the devastation of the 2021 tornado, but everyone had remained in the circle, it just got wider. There was a genuine sweetness and love. Many of these people were the first I met in 1999 when I came on staff to help develop the early service choir and be an associate for David.

The years have gone quickly. As I come to my second retirement, the first being in 2010 from Newnan High School, I cherish the circles that have been drawn around me, the ones opened up to make a space for me and teach me. My time with the music ministry at FUMC has been rewarding in ways that I can't even begin to express. I'll still be around, but now it's time to draw the circle wider, still. Thank you!

Let this be our song, no one stands alone, Standing side by side, Draw the Circle Wide.





On June 5, Newnan First United Methodist Church will host Michael Morgan and the "Stars of his Collection" at 3:30pm. Attendees will have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see and perhaps even touch the first complete English translation of the Bible by John Wycliffe; The First Printed

English New Testament by William Tyndale and an actual first edition of The King James Bible printed in 1611. Additionally, Mr. Morgan is displaying for one of the few times in its life, a private Bible owned by the last woman executed for witchcraft in the United Kingdom.

Mr. Morgan is to have a presentation starting at 4:00pm with time for questions. Everyone will be able to view up close and personal printed editions of the Wycliff Bible, the Tyndale Scriptures, the Bishops Bible and a first printing of the translation authorized by James the VI of Scotland, James I of England known as the King James Bible.

Michael Morgan's talk about these amazing manuscripts and how he came to acquire them will be a fitting and uplifting conclusion to Southern Lit Fest 2022. Don't miss it.
