Brothers and Sisters of NFUMC,

I am writing to you after an incredible Christmas Eve, a beautiful Christmas morning worship service, a brutal Peach Bowl, and a week straight of hanging out with children under the age of 5.

Adair and I spent Christmas with her family (including five nieces and nephews 4 and under) and New Years with mine (one nephew who is 15 months). I've learned a lot about what Christmas looks like before and after kids. Before little children, the holiday season was calm and predictable. I knew what to expect and I had a plan. Now that children are in the picture, predictability has flown out the window. Peace and calm are a thing of the past. 10 years ago, my family time was spent talking about our lives and politics and faith and sports. This Christmas, my family time was spent making faces and weird noises just to try and get a smile out of a 15 month old.

And I wouldn't change any of it!

I experienced in these children a sense of wonder that is part of childhood, I think, and sometimes gets lost after. And their wonder gifted me with a sense of wonder as well. This Christmas, the things I witnessed in these children reminded me that every person I come into contact with started the same way, with the same wonder.

As we enter this new year, I hope I can retain that simple epiphany. I hope I can understand that all of us are seeking just a little bit of wonder. I hope I can be more gracious and kind to those I encounter each day. I hope that I can observe life with a sense of wonder and purity. I pray that I might view life less as a thing to get through and more as something to be experienced. For God is at work in the big things and the little things around us. God is at work in you and has been ever sense you were an infant. And God will continue to move in your life, to sanctify you and strengthen you, to care for you and guide you. Just make sure your eyes and ears are open. Make sure you know how wonderful the world is around us. And be on the lookout.

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. People do not light a lamp and put it under the bushel basket; rather, they put it on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." -Matthew 5:14-16 NRSV

In August of 2022, Rev. Andrew presented a vision to our church council. The vision had three parts, each of which we hope to reach by the end of May 2023:

- To have 50 new family-units (last names) join the church as members.
- To have 5 new adult professions of faith
- For each person in the congregation to invite 5 people to church.

The great news: in 2022, we had 26 new family units join the church! These are all incredible folks, many of whom have already become integral parts of small groups, leadership, and missions here in our congregation. I hope that you will look through the list of names and faces on the following page and pray for them, get to know their faces, and intentionally be in communion with them during this new year.

And... there is still work to be done. So far, we have had 0 adult professions of faith. We are doing a great job with nurturing and walking with fellow disciples, which is crucial and important work and in line with our biblical calling. But where are we inviting people into discipleship?

When was the last time you invited someone to church? Have you talked with someone about a sermon you heard, a hymn that has been on repeat in your head, a book that your Sunday school class just started? Do we have a ministry at the church that you think a friend's gifts would align with, or something that would help meet a need they have? A mission project they can join in on? All of this serves as an invitation, revolving around the good news of Jesus Christ.

Your evangelism task in January is this: talk to one person who is not in our church about our church and Jesus. What are their feelings about church in general? What do they struggle with regarding church and the Christian faith, and what do they admire about it? What do you love about our church that you would love for them to experience?

No, you don't have to have all the answers. And yes, it may be uncomfortable. If I'm honest, it makes me uncomfortable sometimes.

But that's good. Discomfort is where we grow, and where we rely on God the most. These conversations open the door for the good news to be shared and to grow, both for others and for ourselves.


