Friends and Family of Newnan FUMC,

I recently reread Langston Hughes' short story "One Christmas Eve," which tells of a 1933 Christmas in which segregation is still a reality and a little boy named Joe who is not allowed to see Santa because of the color of his skin. He tries to get close and when Santa sees him, he is rude and mean to Joe. When Joe later reunites with his mother, he tells her about his brief encounter with Santa, and his mother replies, "That wasn't Santa. If it had been, he wouldn't have treated you that way."

Hughes' story has haunted me since and has caused me to reflect on the idea that Christians have been called to embody someone far greater than Santa, and yet we fall short. We have been called to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, and still, I wonder how many have encountered me, and had a conversation afterward that went something like, "No, that wasn't a Christian. If it had been, he wouldn't have treated you that way." Indeed, Langston Hughes' tale serves as a stark reminder that our actions and interactions with others reflect upon our faith and our calling to embody Christ's love.

Thankfully, the Christian calendar gives us an opportunity every year to start over, to approach the birth and life of Jesus anew, and to recommit ourselves to following Jesus. Every year, we are given the opportunity to enter into Advent once more, to imagine first-century Bethlehem, a couple on their way, pregnant with a child. We are allowed moments to picture the story once again in Luke, where there is no room in the inn. And we are asked to reflect on the simple question (among many others) – Would we make room for Jesus if we had the chance? Or would we simply declare, "No room!" shut our doors, covered with greenery and Christmas spirit, and leave a family in the cold, alone and wondering if the people on the other side of that door really knew what Christmas was all about?

This Advent and Christmas season, I pray that we might repent of our own shortcomings and recommit ourselves to embodying the true spirit of Christmas – a spirit of love, compassion, and open doors. May we strive to be the hands and feet of Christ, creating a more just and loving world for all. And may any we encounter leave our presence thinking to themselves, "I think that person knows what Christmas is all about."

On Wednesday, November 15th, we had the opportunity to look back and celebrate the ways that this church has served during the past year. I am so proud of this congregation, and we have a lot to celebrate. In 2023, we gave over \$80,000 to local and international mission partners, with an emphasis on giving toward local Newnan non-profits like Bridging the Gap. Through donations brought each Mission Sunday, we have donated dozens of grocery carts worth of dry food goods to One Roof to be given to the hungry in our community. And at Annual Conference this past June, our church was recognized in front of every United Methodist Church in the North Georgia Conference as we received the Church of Excellence in Outreach Award, given for meeting the highest standards of United Methodist Missions in the Conference.



There is much left to be done for the kingdom of God, and I am excited that the work will continue. We welcome our new Missions Chair, Peter Sheren. Peter and his wife Ivonne joined our church last year, and are long-time Methodists with a heart for service. The Sherens went on our church's mission trip to Guatemala, and there heart for showing others the love of God through both word and deed was on full display. We are excited to welcome Peter into this role!

He has big shoes to fill. As we welcome Peter as our Missions Chair, we give thanks for the 5 years of incredible leadership of Greg Oothoudt. Greg has served at our church as missions chair since 2019, and has lead the church in our efforts to be the hands and feet of Christ. Through staff changes, the Covid-19 pandemic, and the 2021 EF-4 tornado, Greg has pushed this church to take seriously the call to love our neighbors not just with our words, but with our actions. We are so grateful for Greg's leadership and give thanks that he will still be a part of our church body (while catching a breather). If you have the chance, you can send a kind note to Greg for his service to the church, and we will make sure it is delivered to him.

NEST VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

The Newnan Emergency Shelter Team (NEST) is a local partnership of churches that provide a warm shelter for our neighbors who are homeless. On nights when the temperature drops below 35°F, the



NEST mobilizes to ensure that those without a home have a place to go where they are fed dinner, can sleep at night in a warm safe space, and eat breakfast in the morning.

Our church has committed to helping out on Saturday nights and Sunday mornings. This involves picking up a meal and picking up folks on Saturday night in the church bus, dropping them of at a hotel that night, and then picking them up with breakfast on Sunday morning around 10AM (you can still make it to worship at 11!). Hello all!

We've made it to the season of Advent - a time when we celebrate the hope, peace, love, and joy surrounding the birth of Jesus. For me, the music of this season is some of my favorite in the church year. It is always so hard to program for these four weeks - so many great Christmas hymns, so little time! As you've likely seen from the church calendar, this season is overflowing with great opportunities for worship. We hope you'll all attend the Children's Pageant on December 3rd during the Sunday school hour. What says Christmas more than those sweet babies telling the story of Christ's birth?!

The following Sunday, December 10th, I hope you'll join us at either 3:00 p.m. or 6:00 p.m. (or both!) for O Holy Night. I know that this night of music-making is a major tradition for the church, and I cannot wait to experience it for the first time! I know all of the groups have been preparing Christmas music for some time, and they look forward to sharing that with all of you. Finally, on Sunday, December 17th, we will be hosting a Service of Lessons and Carols. I've gotten to sing this piece on two occasions, but this is the first time I've ever had the joy of preparing it with a choir and orchestra. From the opening wind chimes, the piece takes the listener on a journey. It is as if you can hear those wind chimes and the choir calling

you from over the hills to celebrate that Christ is born. It is my hope that this piece, and the others, will stir in you the same emotions they stir in me, rekindling the spirit needed to go back out in the world and make disciples for Jesus Christ.

I hope that, no matter how much chaos and noise the world around you makes in this season, you take the time to be still and reflect on the blessings you've experienced this year. I hope that you take the time to pray about how you can share those blessings with others. I hope you feel those blessings so deeply in your heart, and that the music we experience together in this season reminds you of the hope, peace, love, and joy we have to share with the world.
